2017-18 Money Map for Housing/Homeless Service Provision OVERVIEW

This money map was based off a collective impact analysis of homelessness funding modeled in Salt Lake County, Utah and is an update from a 2015-16 money map prepared by Marion County to reflect the most recent efforts. The purpose of the map is to identify the major public funding sources and recipients being leveraged to address homelessness ¹ throughout the participating entities within the Mid-Willamette Homeless Initiative, with the goal of a deeper understanding of the resources within our continuum. This map may be useful in identifying areas of resource richness as well as gaps, and to guide future planning efforts. The map intentionally focuses on public funding only and should not be considered an exhaustive list of all resources for homeless services within the region. The resources represented are unduplicated to the best of our ability; however, some instances of duplication may be present. Thank you to all organizations that provided information in support of this project.

¹ "Addressing homelessness" encompasses prevention, stabilization and supportive services aimed at those who may be considered at-risk of experiencing homelessness in addition to the direct services for those experiencing homelessness.
